
CSANZ Travelling Fellowships to ESC 2022

Global Shortage of X-ray contrast medium

CSANZ is aware of the current global shortage of X-ray contrast medium for intravenous or intraarterial use attributed largely to COVID lockdown affecting manufacturing.

This is having a significant impact on our ability to provide imaging and therapeutics in the daily management of a wide range of heart disease patients.

CSANZ has written to all State Health Ministers alerting them to the impact on cardiac patient care, the risks this shortage poses and the importance of maintaining an adequate supply of contrast, particularly at centres that deliver emergency care for acute cardiac patients.

The TGA issued a statement on its website on Monday https://www.tga.gov.au/alert/shortage-iodinated-contrast-media-contrast-diagnostic-agents and advises it has authorised the supply

of an overseas-registered product to help reduce the impact of this shortage.

CSANZ will continue to monitor the situation and provide any updates to Members when received.
