

Latest Journal Articles

Position Statement Provides Guidance on the Management of Adults Patients with Elevated Lipoprotein(a).

Elevated lipoprotein (a) [Lp(a)] is now recognised as an independent and causative risk factor for atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease and calcific aortic valve disease, according to the recently released Australian Atherosclerosis Society Position Statement. Elevated Lp(a) is known to be strongly associated with an increased risk of myocardial infarction, stroke, peripheral artery disease, heart failure and cardiovascular mortality.

Pulmonary Hypertension in Aortic Regurgitation

Pulmonary hypertension (PHT) is known to complicate left heart diseases (LHD) including left sided valvular pathologies such as a ortic regurgitation (AR). Patients with significant AR have an increased risk of death, even if they do not have symptoms, so identifying variables which predict adverse outcomes is important. PHT is thought to develop in AR due to left ventricular volume overload which eventually leads to increases in left atrial pressure and the development of post-capillary PHT.


