

## **HEART, LUNG AND CIRCULATION | JANUARY HIGHLIGHTS**

Atrial Fibrillation: Introducing Pulsed Field Ablation



Catheter ablation of atrial fibrillation (AF) by pulsed field ablation can be performed safely and efficiently by operators who have previous experience with AF ablation using thermal ablation, according to Lee et al. These Queensland-based authors report their initial experience in 100 consecutive patients with paroxysmal or persistent AF undergoing pulsed field ablation. All pulmonary veins were successfully isolated acutely with no serious complications, and with promising results in early follow-up. Lee et al. say one of the biggest advantages of pulsed field ablation compared with thermal ablation (e.g., radiofrequency energy or cryoablation) is avoidance of collateral damage to adjacent structures. https://www.heartlungcirc.org/article/S1443-9506(23)04405-0/fulltext



## Mitral Valve Repair: Underutilised in Australia?

Australia may be out-of-step with global trends in mitral valve surgery, suggest Cheng et al. Examining available administrative data in New South Wales over 17 years (2001-2017), they found that the proportion of mitral repair as a subset of overall isolated mitral valve surgery—defined as open-heart surgery, only on the mitral valve, with or without CABG—has remained stable at around 34%—38%. This contrasts with a global trend towards increasing use of repair rather than valve replacement (mechanical/bioprosthetic), related to superior outcomes of repair. While acknowledging not only that survival outcomes for all mitral valve procedures was excellent but also that non-clinical data has inherent limitations, the authors do suggest that, overall, mitral valve repair may be potentially under-utilised here, especially when compared with the US and Europe. https://www.heartlungcirc.org/article/S1443-9506(23)04443-8/fulltext


# HLC - From the Editors-in-Chief: Seeking Conveyors of Bright New Ideas


